The new complex will incorporate parts of the existing sports centre, while adding an array of modern facilities, including:

- · A 200-station fitness suite
- · Glass squash courts
- Two 10-court sports halls
- An advanced Sports Performance Clinic
- · Hypoxia chamber
- 60m indoor sprint track
- An anti-gravity treadmill and hydrotherapy pool
- · A climbing wall
- · Dance studios
- A snooker hall
- Plus a martial arts dojo

Construction information



Construction of the new complex is due to start in March 2015 and completion is expected by late 2016.
